## Automotive Collision Technology Technician FMTC

Length: 1400 hours (13 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$9,784

Students learn basic trade skills in refinishing; sheet metal repair frame and unibody squaring and aligning; use of fillers, paint systems and undercoats; related welding skills; trim-hardware maintenance; glass servicing; and other miscellaneous repairs as well as cost estimation and customer service expertise.

**Certification:** Automotive Service Excellence (ASE)

## Automotive Maintenance and Light Repair Technician FMTC **DEV**

600 hours (5 months)

Cost: \$3,317

This program prepares students for entry level employment as a professional service technician at an automotive dealership or independent repair facility. The program content includes, but is not limited to: basic technician skills, general engine fundamentals, general electrical systems, suspension and steering systems, brake systems, HVAC systems, engine performance systems, and automatic and manual transmission/transaxle systems. Students learn to conduct basic repairs and maintenance on automobiles and light truck systems.

**Certification:** Automotive Service Excellence (ASE)

## Barbering CCTC

Length: 900 hours (9 Months)

Cost: \$4,111

Students learn skills such as shaping hair, performing hairstyles, mustache and beard design, shaving the face and performing facial treatments. Additional training includes hairpieces, wigs, and hair attachments; permanent waves, chemical relaxing, coloring and highlighting, and entrepreneurship. This program stresses safety, Florida barbering laws and rules, and the related chemistry, bacteriology, anatomy and physiology and development of skills in performing the manipulative techniques in the practice of barbering.

**Certification:** Students prepare for the Barber License examination which is governed by the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation.



## Basic Recruit Training Program for Florida Correctional Officers SWFPSA

Length: 445 hours • Cost: \$3,473.15

Practical skills and field experiences are an integral part of this program which includes courtroom demeanor and testifying; report writing; interviewing; communications; controlling and restraining techniques; weapons training; chemical agent applications; physical fitness training; fingerprinting; substance abuse recognition; emergency preparedness techniques; and interpersonal skills.

**Certification:** Florida Department of Law Enforcement

## Biomedical Equipment Repair Technology FMTC

Length: 1140 hours (11 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$4,392

A biomedical equipment repair technician specializes in calibrating, maintaining, and repairing the medical machinery used in a healthcare facility. Students will learn how to handle complex machinery such as ventilators, infusion pumps, cardiac monitors, and defibrillators. They will also perform safety checks on electrical equipment, wheelchairs, and radiological diagnostic testing machines. The Biomedical Equipment Repair Technology program content includes, but is not limited to, hydraulics, pneumatics, optics, and mechanics to troubleshoot, service, and repair equipment commonly used for treatment, diagnosis, and monitoring of patients in a medical environment.

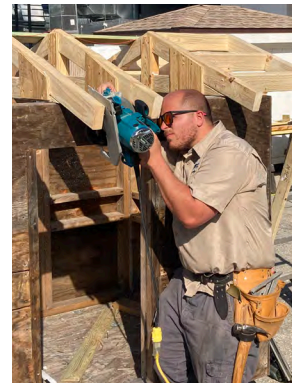
## Carpentry FMTC **DEV**

Length: 1200 hours (11 months)

Cost: \$6,407

Students learn the use of hand and power tools, safety, selection and use of materials, estimating, blueprint reading, and shop and tool safety, floor & wall framing, handling and storage of materials, roof systems, stair preparation, blueprint reading, exterior and interior finishes, site preparation and layout, window installation and applied math.

**Certification:** National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Carpentry Level 1



## Correctional Probation Officer SWFPSA

Length: 562 hours

Cost: \$4015.79

The purpose of this program is to prepare students for initial employment as a certified correctional probation officer in the state of Florida. To successfully complete this training program, recruits must achieve a passing score on each of the written end-of-course examinations. Recruits must also demonstrate proficiency skills in the high liability courses (first aid, firearms, and defensive tactics) and participate in the CJSTC Physical Fitness Program. See Rules 11B-35.001 and 11B-35.0024, FAC. (IN028.1.)

## CNC Production Specialist FMTC

Length: 600 hours (5 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$3,861

The CNC Production Specialist program acquaints students with the basic manufacturing operations, such as safety, shop math, blueprint reading, basic Geometric Dimensioning and Tolerancing (GD&T), and metrology. Students will transition into performing tasks encountered in a manufacturing environment including selecting tools, raw materials, work holding, and the steps involved in preparing CNC equipment for operation. Students will also learn how to utilize CAD/CAM software to assist in performing tasks associated with running production on a CNC machine such as quality measurement and tool compensation.

## Cosmetology CCTC FMTC

Length: 1200 hours (11 months)

Cost: \$4,515 (CCTC)

Cost: \$6,308 (FMTC)

Our Cosmetology course prepares you for an exciting career in the beauty industry. The program includes knowledge in styling, haircutting, coloring as well as caring for skin and nails. You will be guided by dedicated professional instructors committed to helping you attain your goals.

**Certification:** Upon successful completion of the program, you will become eligible to apply and take the Florida Cosmetology Exam.

## Crossover from Correctional Officer to Law Enforcement Officer SWFPSA

Length: 518 hours

Cost: \$2,551.56

The purpose of this program is to give correctional officers the training they need to become certified law enforcement officers. This program is approved by the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement.

## Dental Assisting CCTC

Length: 1230 hours (11 months)

Cost: \$7,515

Pursue a career in the exciting field of dentistry! Students learn general chair side techniques, dental lab and business office administration. Earn a state certificate in dental radiography and dental assisting expanded functions. Prepare to and take the Dental National Board Exam exam to become a Certified Dental Assistant.

**Certifications:** Upon successful completion of DANB exams student earn EFDA, Dental Radiographer, and CDA.

## Diesel Maintenance Technician FMTC

Length: 600 hours (5 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$5,933

The Diesel Maintenance Technician program is designed to prepare students for employment as Truck, Bus, and Diesel Mechanics in the Heavy-Duty Truck and Bus Repair industry. The content includes, but is not limited to: system diagnostics, commercial motor vehicle preventative maintenance, air brakes systems, employability, and Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) procedures.

## Digital Design CCTC

Length: 1200 hours (11 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$4,428

Students develop dynamic creativity and software knowledge in the fields of graphic design and advertising promotion. Print and web design are focal points in this intensive and relevant career preparation program. Professional-based software programs include Adobe Photoshop, InDesign, Illustrator, and more.

## Electricity FMTC

Length: 1200 hours (11 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$7,888

Students will use and maintain tools and accessories used by professionals in the electrical industry; read and interpret electric codes; demonstrate DC and AC electrical circuit skills; and solve problems using critical thinking skills, creativity, and innovation.

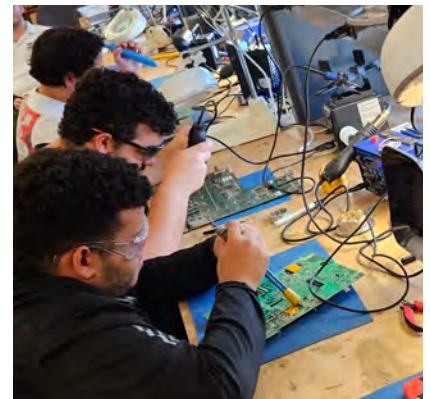
## Electronic Technology CCTC FMTC

Length: 1400 hours (14 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$4999(CCTC)

Cost: \$5,552 (FMTC)

Students train for today's booming industrial sectors: medical equipment, control systems, drone technology, robotics, telecommunications, and solar/wind technologies. From circuits to micro-processors, soldering to troubleshooting, and repairing various electronic equipment, students learn the foundations in order to keep up with rapid changes in industrial technology.

## Emergency Medical Technician - ATD SWFPSA

Length: 300 hours

Cost: \$3,742.70

This program prepares students for employment as emergency medical technicians to function at the basic pre-hospital emergency medical technician level and treat various medical/trauma conditions using appropriate equipment and materials. This program prepares students for certification as EMT's in accordance with Chapter 64J of the Florida Administrative Code.

## Firefighter /Emergency Technician - Combined SWFPSA

## Florida Law Enforcement Academy SWFPSA

Length: 770 hours

Cost: \$4,856.15

This program prepares students for employment as entry-level law enforcement officers and meets the requirements of the Florida Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission.

**Certification:** Upon successful completion of the program, students are eligible to take the State Certified Examination for Law Enforcement, the required test to become a certified law enforcement officer in the state of Florida.

## Heating, Ventilation, Air-Conditioning/ Refrigeration (HVAC/R)FMTC

## Master Automotive Service Technology FMTC

Length: 1800 hours (15 months) **DEV**  
Cost: \$9,749

The complexity of modern vehicles makes automotive service and repairs a high-tech profession, requiring technicians to work with some of the most sophisticated computerized control systems on the market. Students will diagnose, maintain, repair, and fine tune a wide range of vehicles alongside a master technician while utilizing advanced diagnostic equipment in a modern facility to troubleshoot and repair complex automotive systems. This program has Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) Education Foundation accreditation.

## Mechatronics Technology FMTC

Length: 1550 hours (14 months) **DEV**  
Cost: \$5,990

The Mechatronics Technology program is designed to provide graduates with a high-tech skill set and knowledge in electronic, mechanical, fluid power/pneumatic systems, electrical, Program Logic Controller applications (PLC) programming, computer technology for maintenance and repair of PLC/computer controlled, automated machines and robotic systems.

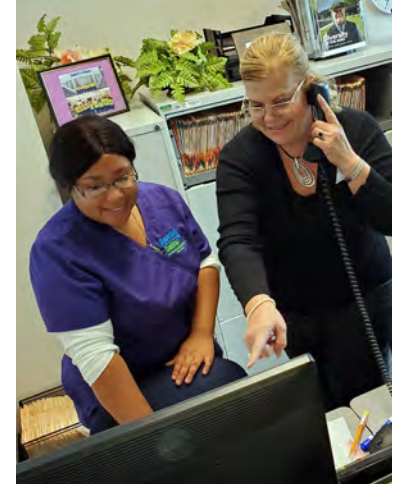

## Medical Administrative Specialist CCTC

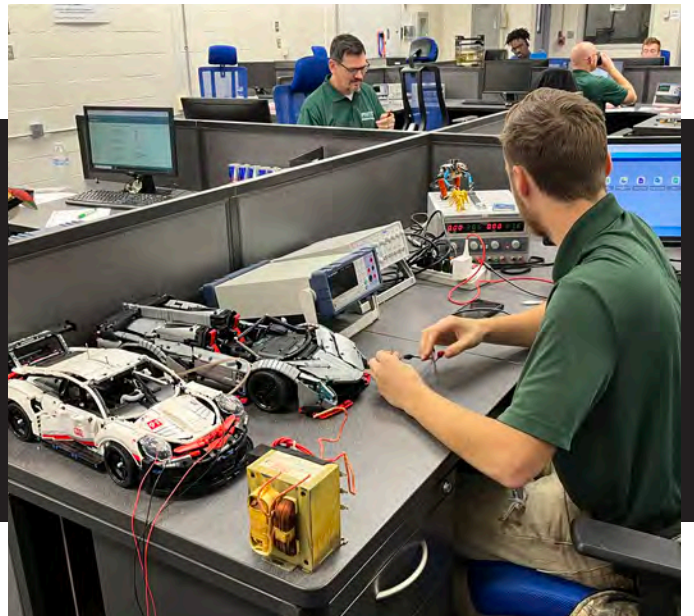
Length: 1050 hours (10 months)  
Cost: \$4,370 **DEV**

This program provides a broad foundation of office skills. The focus is on basic medical knowledge to work in the medical field, however the skill set students develop easily transfer to various business-related administrative assistant positions. Students learn the concepts of running the front of a medical office and managing an electronic records system. In addition, students gain hands-on computer skills utilizing Windows and Microsoft Office applications.

**Certifications:** Microsoft Word; Excel; Power Point and Outlook, you may also be eligible for national certification exam in Certified Medical Administrative Assistant (CMAA)

## Medical Assisting CCTC

Length: 1300 (12 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$6,530

Start a career in the wildly popular medical field! Students learn clerical and managerial skills, competencies in ECG, phlebotomy, laboratory skills, patient care and patient education. Become eligible for national certification exams in CCMA, Certified ECG Technician and Certified Phlebotomy Technician.

Certifications: CCMA (Certified Clinical Medical Assistant), Certified ECG Technician, Certified Phlebotomy Technician

## Medical Coder/Biller FMTC

Length: 1110 hours (10 months)

Cost: \$4,784 (FMTC - 100% online)

This course prepares you for the future of medical coding, insurance billing and insurance reimbursement, as well as CPC review and CPC preparation. We are currently teaching ICD-10 diagnostic and CPT procedural coding systems. With the transition in the United States to ICD-10, you will be trained in the global standard in medical coding & billing.

## .NET Application Development & Programming FMTC

Length: 1050 hours (12 months)

Cost: \$4,453 (100% online)

Learn how to create a Windows phone App, an N-tier web application, and how to incorporate an SQL database on the Windows platform. These are the skills that IT managers are seeking. Classroom work is combined with client projects in a setting that simulates the work environment.

**Certifications:** Knowledge Pillars LLC: HTML/CSS Coding Specialist, JavaScript Coding Specialist, Python Coding Specialist, WordPress Certified Editor, C# Specialist

## Network Systems Administration CCTC

Length: 1050 hours (10 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$5,261

This program is designed to prepare students for employment as a computer network administrator, wireless administrator, server administrator, data communicational analyst, security administrator and is the prerequisite for the Cloud Computing & Virtualization course.

Certifications: During this program, it is highly recommended that students test for the following certifications: Net+, Security+, Certified Wireless Network Administrator (CWNA), RedHat, A+, CySA+



## Nursing Assistant (Articulated) CCTC FMTC

Length: 165 hours (6 weeks) **DEV**

Cost: \$1,255 (CCTC)

Cost: \$1,290 (FMTC)

As a student, you will learn to provide basic care to patients in the hospital, as well as long term care. This course includes instruction in Basic Healthcare Worker and Nursing Assistant. Certification: After completing the course, you are eligible to take the Florida Nursing Assistant Certification Exam.

## Nursing Assistant (Long-Term Care) CCTC

Length: 120 hours, Part-Time (4 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$1123 (CCTC)

As a student, you'll work directly with patients and nurses in the hospital and long-term care settings.

**Certification:** After completing the 120-hour course, you are eligible to take the Florida Nursing Assistant Certification Exam.



## Optometric Assisting CCTC

Length: 1080 hours (10 months)

Cost: \$4,546

Over the course of 10 months, students will learn the procedures and equipment used in diagnosing and treating eye and vision deficiencies and office procedures related to the vision care field. As part of our training program, students receive real world experience under the supervision of a highly trained instructor and industry representatives, such as Optometrists, through off-campus clinical rotations and our on-site Vision Clinic.

**Certifications:** Certified ParaOptometric Assistant and CPR

## ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE

Students who require assistance in strengthening learning skills in reading, mathematics and language are provided with opportunities to enroll in Lee County Adult Education programs for support in ESOL and/or Applied Academics classes. These programs are available online, as well as at various school sites throughout Lee County.

## Paramedic - SWFPSA

Length: 1100 hours (10 months)

Cost: \$10,281.06

This program prepares students for employment as paramedics to function at the basic pre-hospital emergency medical technician - paramedic level and treat various medical/trauma conditions, using appropriate equipment and materials. The program prepares students for certification as paramedics in accordance with Chapter 64E-2 of the Florida Administrative Code. The content includes but is not limited to: patient assessment, advanced airway management, cardiovascular emergencies, external and internal bleeding and shock, traumatic injuries, fractures, dislocations, sprains, poisoning, heart attack, stroke, diabetes, pharmacology, medication administration, respiratory emergencies, endocrine emergencies, acute abdomen, communicable diseases, patients with abnormal behavior, substance abuse, the unconscious state, emergency childbirth, pediatric and geriatric emergencies, burns, environmental hazards, communications, documentation, extrication, mass casualty incident, incident command system, and transportation of patient.

## Plumbing FMTC

Length: 1080 hours (10 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$7,537

Get the training you need to enter the ever expanding field of plumbing. Opportunities abound in Construction, Maintenance, Water Treatment, Solar and more. Students in this class get both hands on experience and earn a national certification as a first year apprentice. Essential competencies include: OSHA 10 Safety Training, CPR First Aid, Plumbing System design, installation and maintenance, Plan Reading, Solar Water Heating Pools, Spas, Wells and Backflow Protection.

**Certification:** National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) Plumbing Level 1

## Practical Nursing CCTC FMTC

Length: 1350 hours (13 months - full-time); (24 months -part-time)

Cost: \$9012 (CCTC)

Cost: \$8,448 (FMTC)

As a student, you'll work directly with patients, nurses, and physicians in the hospital and other health care facilities. After completing the program, successfully, you are eligible to take the Practical Nurse National Licensing Exam (NCLEX-PN). Full-time classes are available on both campuses. Part-time classes are available at Cape Coral Technical College.

**Certifications:** AHA BLS; IV Therapy; NCLEX-PN (Post graduation)



## Professional Culinary Arts & Hospitality CCTC FMTC

Length: 1200 hours (11 months) **DEV**

Cost: \$5,272 (CCTC)

Cost: \$5,548 (FMTC)

Enjoy the fruits of your labor! Learn a highly professional and individually creative career in culinary arts. Enhance your communication skills as you prepare for employment in a fast-paced environment. This program features daily hands-on experience as students prepare cuisine for the entire school.



**Certifications:** Earn a certificate as a ServSafe® Food Manager, the industry gold standard, and the optional ACF Certified Culinarian with a minimum of one year of field experience.

## Professional Nursing (LPN to RN) FMTC

Length: 900 hours (12 months)

Cost: \$7,316

The Professional Nursing (LPN-RN) Program is designed to prepare students who currently hold a valid, unencumbered Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) license issued by the Florida Board of Nursing to pass the licensing examination and gain employment as a Registered Nurse (RN). The program includes classroom, simulation, and clinical experience in local healthcare facilities throughout Lee County.

According to the Florida Board of Nursing and the F.S. 464.019, the diploma nursing education program content includes but is not limited to at least fifty percent clinical training, and no more than half of that clinical training can be comprised of simulation. This program includes a professional nursing curriculum plan that documents the clinical experience and theoretical instruction in medical, surgical, obstetric, pediatric, geriatric, and psychiatric nursing, in acute care, long-term care, and community settings. The program provides theoretical instruction and clinical application in personal, family, and community health concepts; nutrition; human growth and development throughout the life span; body structure and function; interpersonal relationship skills; mental health concepts; pharmacology and administration of medications; legal aspects of practice; as well as interpersonal relationship and leadership skills; professional role and function; and health teaching and counseling skills.

**Certifications:** Graduates are able to sit for the NCLEX-RN Exam.

*NOTE: According to the Florida Department of Education, this is a Professional Nursing (LPN-RN) program. According to the Florida Board of Nursing, this is a Diploma Nursing program. This program does NOT provide an associate degree; however, graduates are able to sit for the same NCLEX-RN exam as associate degree and bachelor's degree nurses leading to the designation Registered Nurse (RN).*

## Solar Photovoltaic System Design, Installation and Maintenance - Entry Level FMTC

Length: 600 hours (5 months)

Cost: \$4,408

This program provides students with the technical knowledge and skills needed to adapt a solar photovoltaic design; conduct a site assessment; read blueprints; and install, maintain, and troubleshoot a solar photovoltaic system. Students will learn basic electricity concepts in DC and AC electrical circuits, voltage, and electric codes, as well as practice hands-on basic residential wiring. Solar installation site assessments and design skills will be developed through hand sketches, use of IT Technology and Computer Aided Drafting software.

**Certification:** North American Board of Certified Energy Practitioners (NABCEP) Associate

## Specialized Career Education, Comprehensive FMTC

Length: 900 hours (9 months)

Cost: \$3,666

The purpose of this individualized job preparatory program is to provide specialized career education for students with an intellectual disability who may need instructional accommodations in the CTE program in order to meet individual interests, abilities, and learning needs. The goal is integrated competitive employment in the student's chosen occupation. The program is individualized for each student and documented in an individualized plan of study (IPS).

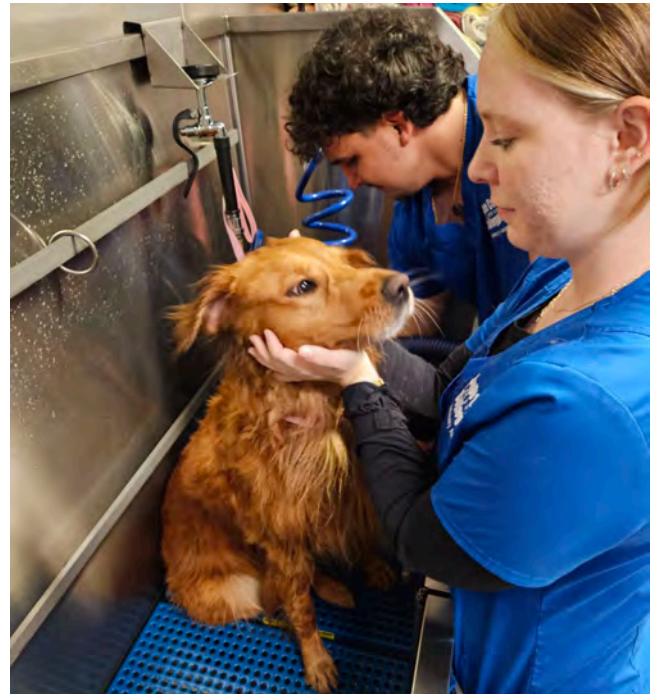
## Turbine Generator Maintenance, Inspection and Repair FMTC

Length: 1200 hours (11 months)

Cost: \$7,350

Experience the adventure of traveling the country and get paid well to troubleshoot, and overhaul large gas and steam turbine generators. The program has a focus on hands on training, learning about proper methods of disassembly and assembly of large equipment including inspection and repair methods using precision measuring tools. Students will also learn about the auxiliary equipment in power plants and manufacturing such as pumps, valves, piping systems, boilers and electrical systems.
